

Visit Guidance Notes

- On arrival please report to The Fusilier Museum reception on Moss Street. A member of staff will greet your group
- Please talk to the children before you leave and upon arrival at the museum about safe procedures. Make sure they understand what they can and can't do
- The recommended ratios for adults to children are: 1:4 for foundation, 1:6 for Key Stage 1, 1:10 for Key Stage 2 and above. We ask that enough adults are present to supervise pupils in small groups
- We don't allow any food or drink to be consumed in the Museum. However, you
 can arrange to eat packed lunches in the Education room, or the garden outside
 the museum, depending on the weather
- If you wish to take photographs please ask for permission first, from a member of museum staff
- Please ensure that you have a list of all the children on the visit with you at all times. If this is your regular class list, please ensure that any absentees are clearly marked and that any extras are added on. We may need to use this list in the event of an emergency evacuation. If the fire alarm sounds while you are in the building, please make your way with your group to the nearest exit. Museum staff will help you if you are unsure. All the exits are clearly marked
- The session may involve an element of object handling. Pupils must handle all objects with care, passing carefully and treating objects with respect
